## Notes

**Gesso Panels for Sale:** I have a very small stock of professional and budget ply boards available for students booked on a course. Please email to reserve a board, the cost can be added to your course fee or paid separately. The board will be sent in advance.

**Professional Small:** 25 x 20 cm (£39.00 each inc P&P)

Quality linden wood icon boards, traditional kovcheg (rebated) type, with RSG based gesso to a Greek recipe.

**Budget Ply Icon Boards** 25 x 20 cm (£12.00 each inc P&P)

N.B. These boards will need to be sanded down with to prepare for use. (400, 600, 800 grade Wet & Dry recommended.)

## Gilding (Optional)

The original icon we are studying does not have a halo (anymore) but it does have the remains of a simple gilded background. **Beginners or anyone using thick card as a support will not be able to gild** for technical reasons and should note that the icon's background can easily be painted in yellow ochre instead. (An alternative is to use some imitation leaf + acrylic size.) A painted background is a good option if you also lack time.

- If you wish to gild using genuine leaf (22ct -23ct) it is only possible to gild on a rigid, wooden, gessoed and suitably prepared and sized support (acrylic/shellac size).
- The oil gilding method will be the easiest option in the time available ('12-hour' oil size = recommended maximum drying time).
- Please remember to use the transfer format of leaf for oil gilding (unless you have a gilder's cushion, knife and tip and are experienced handling loose leaf)

Help/tuition with the oil gilding technique will be available, but please spare a thought for the appropriateness and ethical issues of using genuine gold leaf in relation to your painting skills.
